Minor Requirements

Six (6) courses are required for the Asian Studies minor, two of which must be HIS 163 - Modern East Asia and REL 113 - Asian Religions. Three (3) courses must come from the history and culture category, two (2) from political economy, and one (1) course in an Asian language at any level. No more than three (3) courses may be taken in any one department and no more than three (3) languages courses may be counted toward the minor. At least three (3) of the courses must be taken at Rollins, and of these two (2) must be upper division.
