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## **Rollins College Mission Statement**

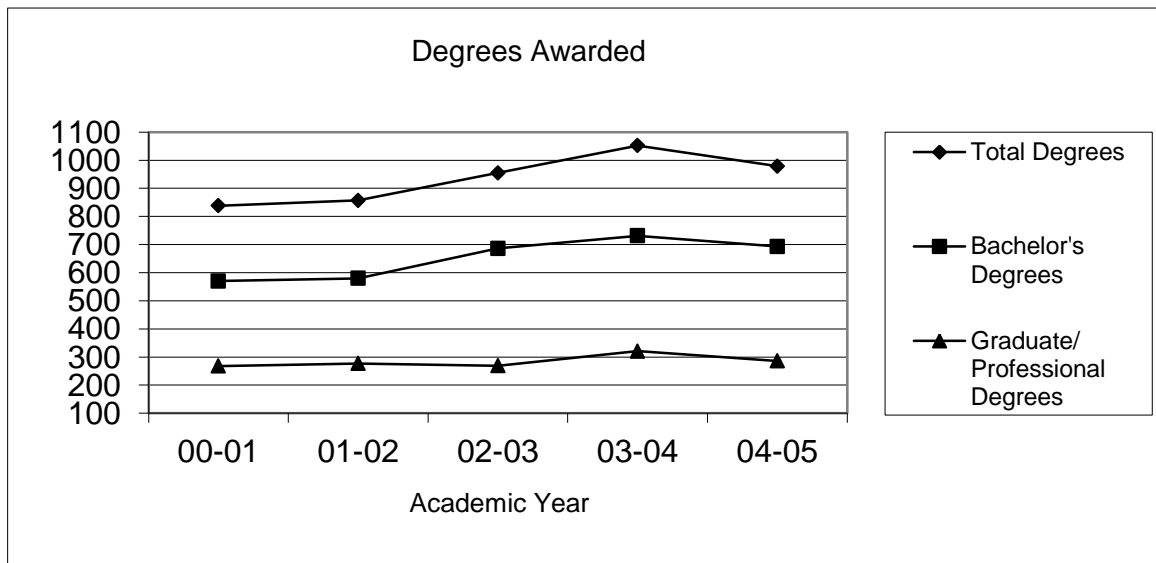

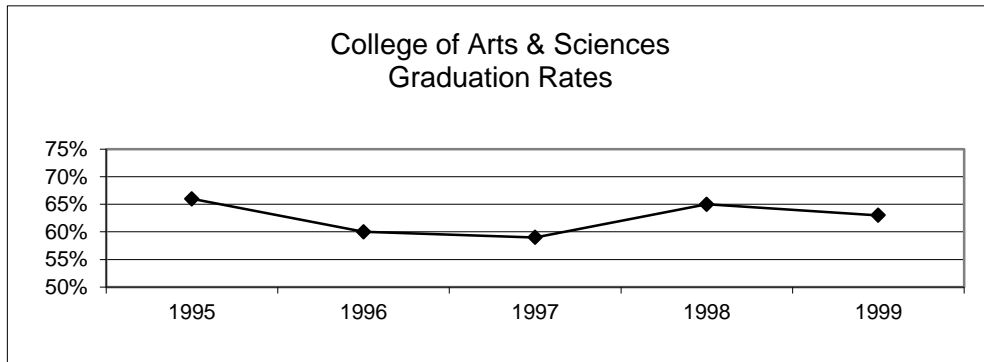

**2005 Top 5 Declared Majors: Organizational Communication, Psychology, International Affairs, English, and Economics**

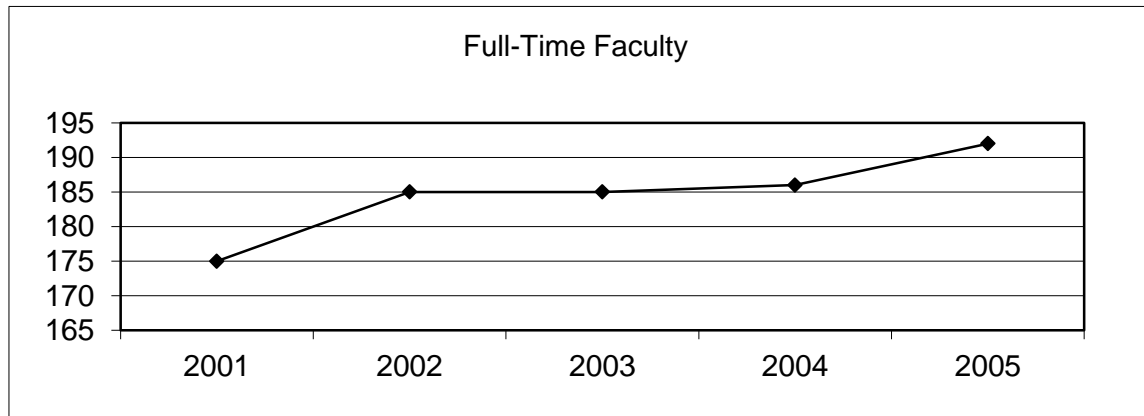

2004 Top 5 Declared Majors: Organizational Communication, Psychology, Economics, International Affairs, and English



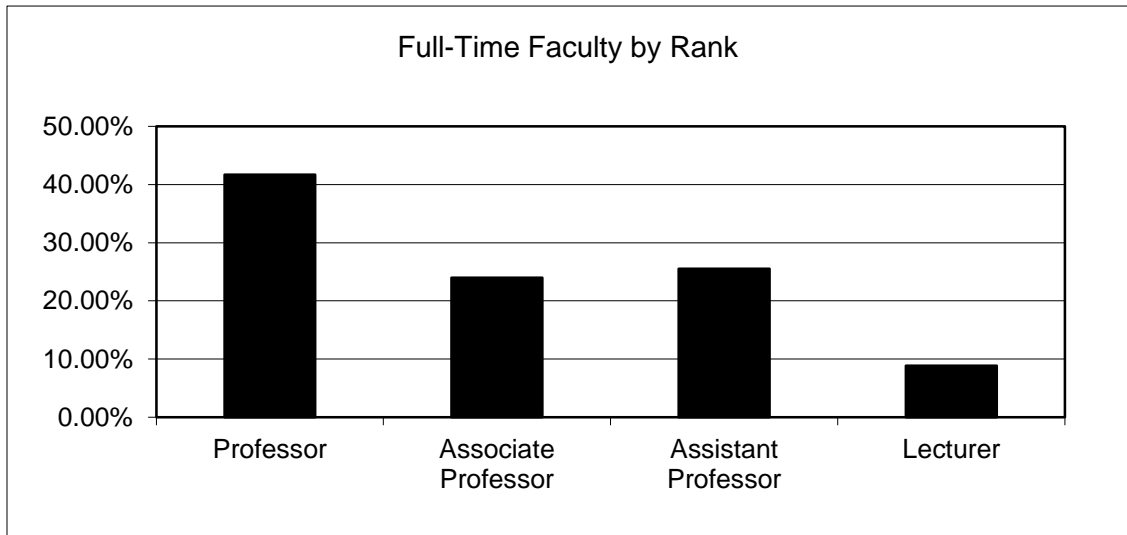
