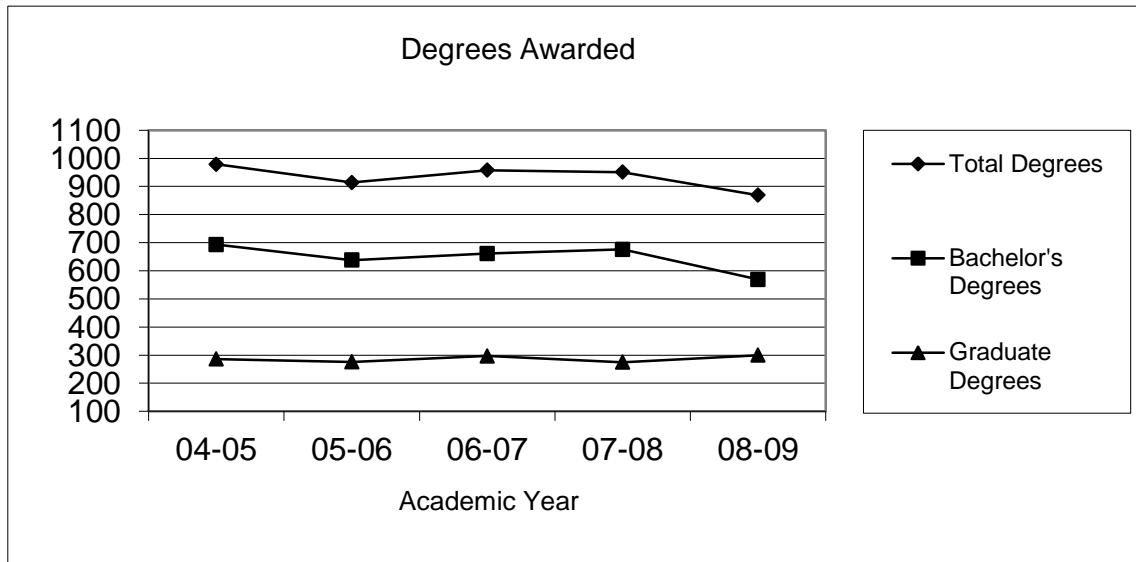

**Total Bachelor's and Master's Degrees Awarded from 2004-05 to 2008-09 = 4671**



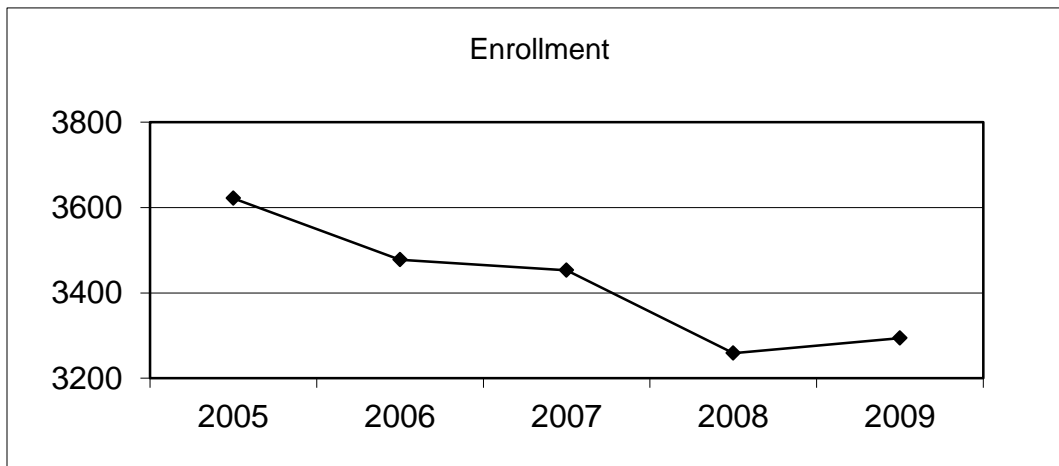

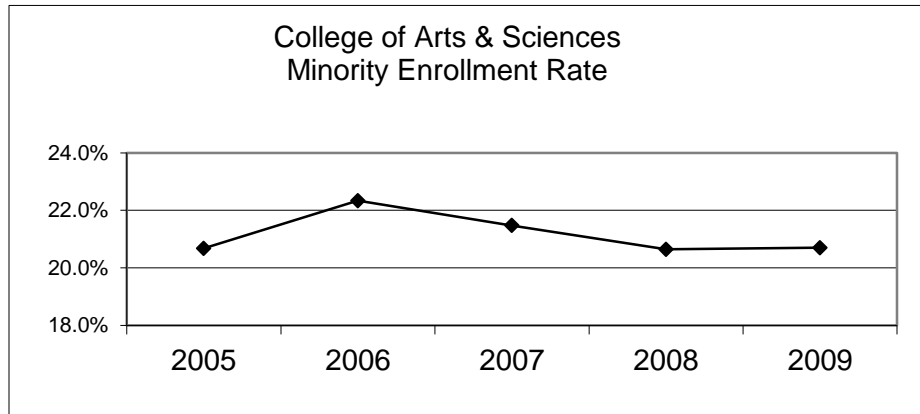

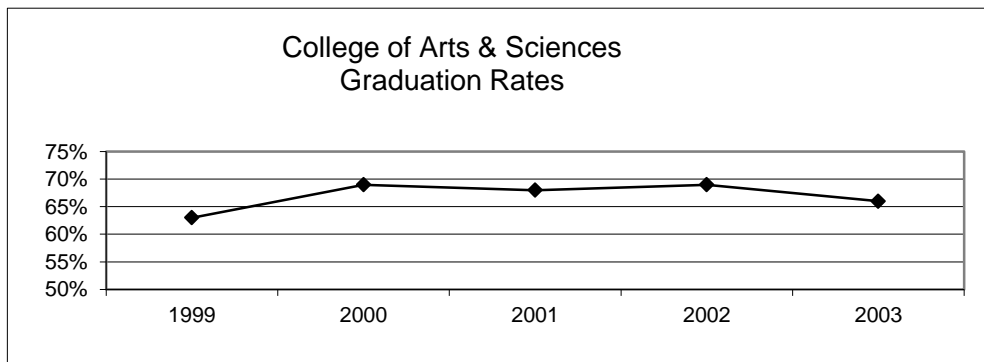
