Nondiscrimination Policy Statement

The Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (excerpt)















How Rankings Are Determined - Summary

Outcomes (35%)

Success at retaining and graduating students within the 150 percent of normal time (six-years).

The success of Pell Grant students. A higher Pell Grant graduation rate scores better than a lower one.

The rate of first-year students who return to campus for sophomore year and eventually graduate.

Social Mobility (5%), graduation and retention (22%) and graduation rate (8%) = 35%

Faculty Resources (20.0%)

Factors include: Class size, Faculty Salary, Highest Degree of Faculty, Student-to-Faculty ratio; Proportion of Full-time Faculty.

Expert Opinion (20%)

Survey of top academics - president, provost and deans of admissions, including peer and high school counselors assessments.

Financial Resources (10%)

Per-student spending, including spending on instruction, research, student services.

Student Excellence (10%)

Standardized Tests (7.75%) and High School Class Standing (2.25%)

Enrollees who took the mathematics and evidence-based reading and writing portions of the SAT and the ACT; and the proportion of those who graduated in the top quarter of their high school classes.

Alumni Giving Rate (5%)

This reflects the average percentage of living alumni with bachelor's degrees who gave to their school during 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, which is an indirect measure of student satisfaction.
