The 54,000-square-foot Olin Library was dedicated in 1985. The building provides an inviting research and study environment with open stacks and study areas throughout, conference rooms, group studies, a coffee shop, and a tower lounge with spectacular views of the campus and community. The library's nine librarians and eleven staff, our services, and collections (in print, online, and in other media) reflect the liberal arts mission of the College and support the needs of our Arts and Sciences, Hamilton Holt, and Crummer students. Located in the Olin Library, the Olin Electronic Research & Information Center complements the library by providing computer labs, multi-media facilities, and a late-night study area. The library has wireless access throughout the building and provides on and off-campus access to over sixty research databases containing thousands of digital books and journal articles. The library at Rollins College has been a selective Federal Depository since 1909. The Archives and Special Collections Department maintains the history of the College and houses the William Sloane Kennedy bequest of works by and about Walt Whitman; the Jesse B. Rittenhouse library of modern poetry and literature; the Mead and Nehrling horticultural papers; and a strong collection of primary documents concerning the history of Winter Park and central Florida.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENTS

Moody's Investors Service reaffirmed Rollins College's A1 underlying rating, which reflects the favorable financial health of the College and is the highest rating received by any private college or university in the state of Florida.

Rollins was ranked sixth in the *Orlando Sentinel's* Top 100 Companies for Working Families in 2010, recognizing the College as a leading family-friendly employer. For the sixth consecutive year, Rollins was named number one among 118 regional universities in the South by *U.S. News & World Report*.

Rollins College recently adopted the National Incident Management System (NIMS), which standardizes the College's approach to emergency incident management and response. In 2010, the College was recognized by the National Association of College and University Business Officers for its forward-thinking efforts in emergency preparedness.

Throughout the past year, the College has completed a series of construction and renovation projects. These projects were planned to support Rollins' educational mission, promote sustainability, improve accessibility, enhance life safety, and address deferred maintenance. Major projects included: complete renovation of Rex Beach Hall, renovation of Rollins Hall, installation of an upgraded sound system in the Annie Russell Theatre, upgrades to the air conditioning and furnishings of the men's varsity locker room in the Alford Sports Center, installation of a new sound system in the Alford Sports Center, and the construction of a new lakeside nature walk path, a lakeside beach, and an outdoor classroom.

Over the summer, a new electronic mail system was implemented. This enhancement will improve e-mail communications to better serve our community.
