- The second phase of Strong Hall was completed in June 2014 and now houses students.
- The Fairbanks Ave. pedestrian crossing from the Sun Trust Garage was relocated in August 2014 to the Interlachen Avenue intersection, providing a direct link from campus to The Alford Inn.
- All overhead utilities (electric, cable, phone) on Interlachen, New England, Fairbanks, and East Lyman have been moved underground.
- Holt Avenue was narrowed in Summer 2014, in conjunction with the widening of Sandspur field.
- The new swim team room was completed at the Alford pool.
