- ◆ The Rollins College Bookstore on Fairbanks will open at the beginning of 2017.
- ◆ The College is currently in the design process for the new Rice Event Pavilion; to be completed in 2017.
- ◆ The College is completing design work on interior renovations for Holt Hall; the work will be completed over the summer of 2017.
- ◆ Design is underway for the relocation of Facilities to the western edge of campus, just west of the 422 building.
- ◆ The College will be building two new single-family residences along Holt Avenue, west of New York Avenue, that will serve as faculty housing. Construction to start early 2017.
