### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Students will explore the relationships of ideology, devotion and commitment to social change. What roles do belief and zealotry play in personal development, for good or ill? What motivates Muslim terrorists, killers of abortion doctors, and those who seek to serve the human family? The lives of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Malcolm X, Aung San Suu Ky, and others will be studied. Students will be led to a better understanding of their own motivation and roles in society.

### COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. Faithful class attendance.
2. Active and informed participation in class discussions.
3. Read and assimilate required material; i.e., texts and handouts.
4. Write brief, occasional reaction papers as assigned.
5. Write two major papers (10-12 papers, double spaced).
  - (a) Study two major figures; e.g., Gandhi and Jinnah, Dom Helder Camera and Archbishop Romero, Cesar Chavez and Walter Reuther, Sarah Palin and Rachel Maddow, highlighting contrasts, similarities and impacts on society. Make an oral presentation to the class based on your research. (Due September 29)
  - (b) Compare the life and teachings of Mohammad to Islamic fundamentalist terrorism today and the life and teachings of Jesus to the beliefs and practices of the Religious Right (extreme expressions of Christian fundamentalism) today. (Due November 10)
